This session was conducted by Dr. Varsha Saxena, Asst. Prof. Chemistry.


TECHNICAL SESSION 2:

2. Dr. H.K.Garg - Teaching, Learning & Evaluation




Resource Person - Dr. Usha Nair






TECHNICAL SESSION 3: PAPER PRESENTATION
